





## Share Some Halloween Goodies with Your Pooch

We all know this is the month of Twix, Snickers, and Three Musketeers. Though chocolate, chocolate, and more chocolate may be on your grocery list, we all know that our pups can't partake in the Halloween goodies. So instead, here's a recipe that is healthy and will surely make Fido's tail wag.



Pumpkin Peanut Butter Dog Treats from Anita at [Dessert First Girl](#)

- 2 1/2 cups whole wheat flour
- 2 large eggs
- 2/3 cup pumpkin purée, canned or fresh
- 3 tbsps peanut butter

Preheat the oven to 350°F. Place all ingredients in the mixing bowl of a stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment. Mix on medium for about a minute or until the dough looks like a bunch of little dough balls. If you pinch a piece and it crumbles, add a little water. If it's really sticky, it's too wet and you'll need to add a little flour. Gather the dough together and form into a ball. Place on a lightly floured work surface and roll it out to about 1/4-inch thickness. You can either use a cookie cutter to cut out cute shapes or use a knife to cut squares or strips. I am pretty sure the dog doesn't care, but I rather prefer the cute shapes. I gather the scraps together and roll them out again and again until I've used up the dough. Place the cookies on a baking sheet. They can be crowded pretty close together since they don't expand much. Bake 15-20 minutes for softer treats or 30 minutes for hard treats (Kaweah likes crunchy treats, just like her person – me). Let cool completely. Makes 100+ 1-inch heart-shaped dog treats.

## Volunteer Spotlight: Anne Williams and Candy O'Connor



### How long have you been volunteering with GRR?

I have been volunteering since our Maggie was adopted in 2004. But I did not get seriously involved until 2008 when I encouraged Candy O'Connor to become a foster mom. I told her if she would foster, I would be her "teammate" and help her with the pups.

### What made you want to volunteer with GRR?

I was so impressed with the adoption procedure. GRR takes such great care to match the right family with the right dog.

### What volunteer position do you hold?

I would consider my position "support." It would not be possible for Candy to foster without support. There is no "I" in "Team." And I cannot foster because of family obligations. My home changes from a one dog home to a three dog home frequently each month. It's a perfect arrangement.

### Explain the activities you participate in as you fulfill this position.

I consider my position a support position. Candy and I work together as a team. We take care of the "Oldie Goldies" and/or Special Needs pups and usually have three dogs. The dogs live at Candy's house. I provide her with support by doing all the trips to the vets, emails, foster reports, and purchase all the dog food and supplies the pups might need. I let Candy concentrate on giving the pups the time, love and attention they need. Candy and I are neighbors, so I am in her home many times during the week. And Candy can call me at anytime 24/7. Right now, Candy and I are fostering Sherman 14-106, Cody 14-097, and Truman 13-037.

### About how many hours do you typically spend volunteering in this position?

It varies; probably about 15 hour a week.

### What is your favorite part about volunteering in this position?

Our favorite part is when Candy and I get to see one of our fosters find their "forever home."

### Describe a cute/funny/interesting story while volunteering in this position.

Our best story is about Scampy # 08-063. He was being adopted and had met his "forever" family including three children. Scampy was always frightened of riding in the SUV and would crouch on the floor. When the family was ready to go, Scampy ran to the van and jumped right into the area between the two back seats. He seemed very proud of himself. There was "instant" love with one of the children. It was a happy day.

### Give one piece of advice for volunteers interested in serving in this position.


This is not a regular volunteer position. It's a position that was worked out and given approval.
